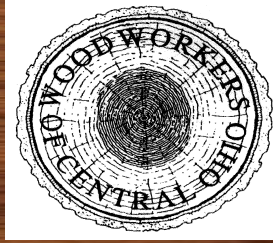

We discussed same at the WOCO Steering Committee meeting today and after a favorable discussion our President, Chuck Caranna, asked Mike Quinn to proceed in making this happen. Mike advises we will be able to do this on-line in June or so and it will be both cheaper and easier to do it in that fashion. Chuck agreed. Bottom line - it will happen sometime this summer.

Hello All:

As Steve mentioned I volunteered to complete the application for 501(c)(3) Exempt status for WOCO. This morning I did some internet research and found that the IRS program "Cyber Assistant" is not yet available. The IRS says it will be available in "2010" but are no more specific than that. Another website (not the IRS's) says that in 2006, 2007 and 2008 the IRS said that the Cyber Assistant program would be available "next year." They also mention that in testing of the program earlier this year several major glitches were uncovered which may delay implementation even further.

We can still file the standard way but the application fee is \$850. If we wait for the software and file electronically the fee drops to \$200. Since we've gotten along so far without 501(c)(3) status my inclination would be to wait for the software and save the \$650. In the meantime I'll begin gathering the required information so we'll be ready to proceed when the software becomes available.

I'll keep checking with the IRS to determine when the software is available but Steve's timetable of "sometime this summer" listed in his e-mail to you might be optimistic. In any event, I'll keep you informed of the status and progress.

Workshop Tip

As woodworkers we appreciate accuracy in our layout and marking skills. Many use a marking knife to give them the accuracy they desire, but for myself I resent having to sand out or scrape those marks on a finished piece. I am equally unhappy with the the inaccuracy of a #2 Ticonderoga wooden pencil held against a straightedge not to mention the need for frequent sharpening. I have found a method that works for me. A few years ago I purchased several architects drawing pencils and now find that I use them exclusively. Although their initial cost may seem high \$8.00 to \$10.00 apiece they offer great accuracy and versatility. Lead widths come in 0.3mm, 0.5mm, 0.7mm, and 1.0mm. I find that the 0.5mm size to be the best. At the 0.5mm size you also have a choice of 5 levels of hardness and again I find than hardness #3 most suited for my needs. As with our other tools you get what you pay for. The German, Scandinavian and American pencils are the most reliable, last the longest and replacement lead is easy to find. With reasonable care these mechanical pencils will last indefinitely. Locally they can be purchased at Long's Book Store and Dick Blick Art Supplies.

The Five-Second, Ten-Cent Shop-Vac Upgrade

The wide (14") nozzle is arguably the most-used attachment on many shop vacuums. Its extra width makes it helpful for cleaning up piles of sawdust and other messes on the garage or shop floor.

Yet for all the use it gets, it seems the nozzle often spends more time pushing messes around than sucking them up. That's because older models of the nozzle produce tight suction against flat concrete floors, which makes them stick in places and prevents them from removing debris properly.

Newer models have changed the design to work more effectively, but even these have a tendency to wear down and develop the same problem over time.



Add Cable Ties — Luckily, we came up with a 10-cent solution to this dilemma that takes about five seconds to implement. Just put two plastic cable ties around the nozzle, one on either side, and pull them tight (Photo above).

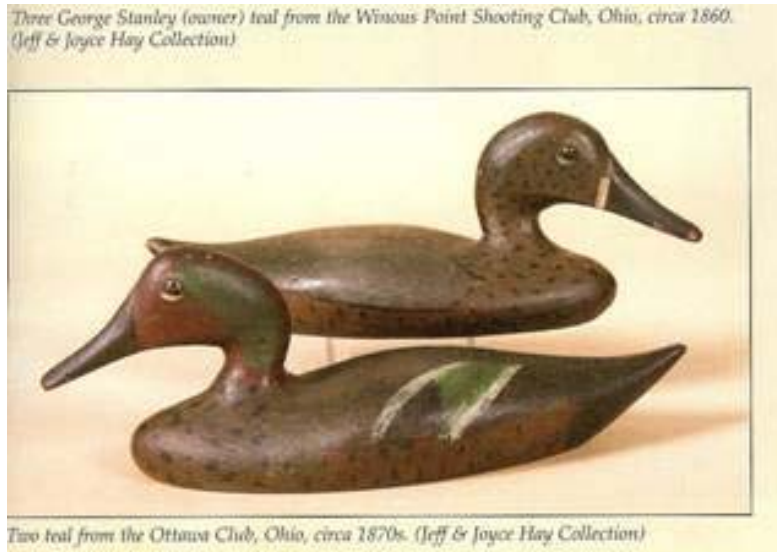
